a) B-BBEE

The tenderers will be evaluated in accordance to PPPFA, where the suppliers will be allocated 10 points as per B-BBEE scorecard below (valid B-BBEE certificate that are SANAS accredited or SWORN AFFIDAVIT that is fully completed, stamped and signed as a mandatory returnable).

b) Localisation

Eskom prefers suppliers to purchase locally produced products or services required within the borders of South Africa. Eskom will be buying a finished product (Office Chairs) from local suppliers therefore, local content to South Africa will be 85% since Eskom do not expect any products or skills to be imported for these transaction and the industry is matured enough to possess all the skills required to source & supply these products. It will form part of subcontracting, skills development and supplier development.

c) Industrialisation

Successful supplier will be encouraged to add value in the value chain by firstly owning their downstream logistics process or assist emerging distributor to setup workshops or distribution stores, give them business, train, mentor and coach them.

d) Skills Development

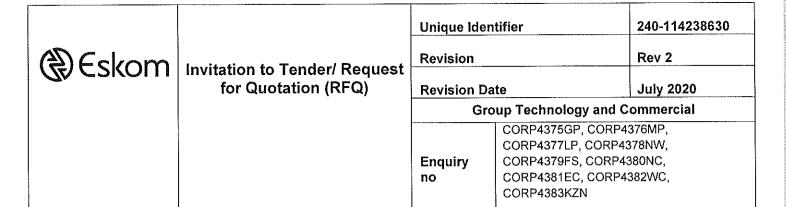

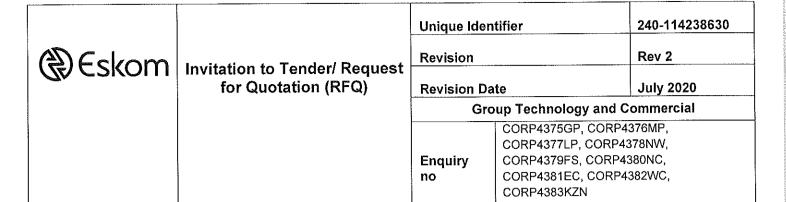

 - 2) A sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice;

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- 3) Any other requirement prescribed in terms of the B-BBEE Act;
- (i) "QSE" means a qualifying small business enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (j) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
